

YWAM Trinidad Dress Code

In the interest of being a positive influence and not wanting to offend any church or individual, we have set a dress code policy that reflects the culture of Trinidad and Tobago.

This dress code is for staff, students and ministry teams. Please note that on ministry outreaches to other countries the dress code can vary in stringency depending on the country.

In general, the church is more conservative here than many places in North America and Europe, so conservative Sunday attire is considered appropriate.

Outreach / Ministry Women

Dresses and skirts should be at least knee length. Collared shirts are recommended. Blouses and tops should have sleeves. T-shirts are permitted. It is recommended that you do not wear flip-flops.

Public and Campus Women

Public – Dresses, skirts or long pants.

Campus – Shorts and sleeveless shirts are fine to wear on the campus for both men and women. No tight clothing, low neck line tops, spaghetti straps, tops exposing the navel, short shorts or miniskirts are permitted.

Swim Wear – Women

Only a one-piece decent swim suit is permitted. Please ensure that you have modest clothes to wear over your swim suit. Beach wear is intended only for the beach. It is not appropriate to wear swimwear or sarongs in public.

Outreach/ Ministry Men

Long pants (no jeans), collared shirts and shoes. Ties are appropriate for speaking events.

Public and Campus Men

Public – long pants and shirts

Campus - Jeans and T-shirts are appropriate.

Please do not wear undershirts by themselves. Men should be not be walking around with bare backs.

Swim Wear – Men

Swimming trunks are appropriate. No speedos.

Of note, nose rings, lip rings, tongue rings, eyebrow rings, men's earrings, ankle bracelets and toe rings are not considered appropriate.
